Mr. Lamson was involved from 1984 to the present as principal planner in the development of the 350-acre Buckland Hills project, the largest mixed-use project in the Town of Manchester. Services provided for this project included working with the Town staff to rewrite the zoning regulations to allow the mixed use development for the site, overall land use planning, coordination of most of the zoning approval applications for final site plan, and architectural design for many of the buildings within the complex.

Services provided for this project included working with the Town staff to amend the existing Buckland Road Gateway Development zoning regulations to allow for a more comprehensive approach to the planning of the overall project and the inclusion of additional uses such as multi-family residential, overall land use planning, and coordination of most of the zoning approval applications for final site plan within Evergreen Walk.
